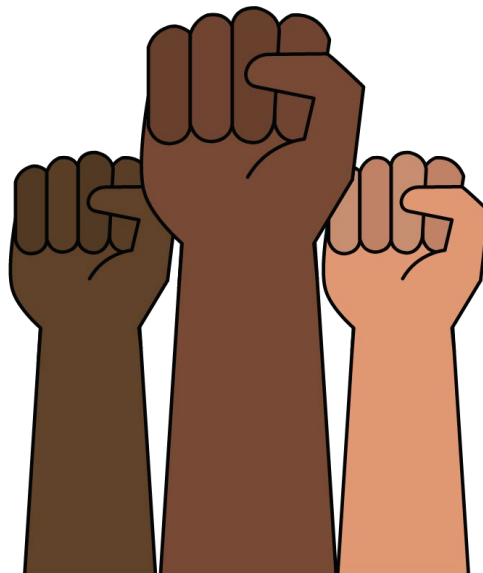
Please include a detailed biography with your nomination; which includes specific contributions to the labour and social justice movements.
